LOCAL SCHOOLS CREATE ART FOR THE FUTURE



Skate parks, lolly shops, trees and parks shone out amongst the artworks drawn by local primary school students for an inspiring community mural now on display at Marysville Rebuilding Advisory Centre (RAC).

With the theme “what my community means to me”, students from the local Buxton Primary School and Marysville Primary School submitted individual artworks to be transformed into a timeless mural made from Laminex Fusion – one of the building products The Laminex Group provided as an in-kind donation for the Marysville RAC.

The budding artists were officially thanked for their participation in the project by The Laminex Group State Marketing Manager – Victoria /Tasmania – Matthew McKelvie.

“As we were providing building materials for the Marysville RAC, we thought it would be rewarding to develop a project to enable the children of the community to be involved in the rebuilding effort,” McKelvie said.

“The result is a wonderfully inspiring wall mural which will be displayed in the Centre for the community to enjoy for years to come,” he added.

The mural is on permanent display in the Marysville RAC, which was fitted out with over \$35,000 worth in-kind donations of material from The Laminex Group for the kitchens, reception area and partitioning systems used in the bathrooms.

Buxton Primary School teacher in charge, Lyn Pope, was extremely excited to be involved in the project.

“The completed mural creates the perfect atmosphere for the community meeting room in the RAC Building. The students enjoyed having the opportunity to express their ideas and hopes for their local community through their individual artworks. It's important that children play a part in the rebuilding process,” Pope said.
